~ On Investigational Therapies ~

It is prudent to consider investigational therapies when the condition you face is life-threatening and standard therapies do not cure.

However, it does not follow that investigational therapies are necessarily safer or more effective than existing therapies.

Therefore, you must read the Informed Consent documents carefully, and seek objective opinions and the guidance of your treating physician.

You do not need your doctor's permission to review clinical trials, contact clinical investigators, or participate in clinical trials.

However, it is best to ask the investigator to consult your treating physician, and for you to consult other experts about the potential risks and benefits of clinical trials you are considering.
